Kansas like Illinois and Wisconsin *does not* have classes in the high school that teach the basic survival skills of sewing and food preparation. A fabric shop, consider it a *survival shop*, host a variety of quilts (ready for purchase pieced together or quilts in blocks ready for purchase to be sewed together), fabrics, and area artists. The area artists include hand-embroidered dish cloths and jewelry. Along with classes on sewing and there are shop hops on fabrics. Hillsboro, the food varies with a traditional food from a religious group of peace believing Mennonites. The small town Mennonite bakery makes the traditional Mennonite lunch biscuit called ‘Bierock’. Hand-made of yeast rising dough bread filled with hamburger, sausage and cabbage baked along with spices. Very tasty and filling. Though suggested mustard or another condiment for added taste for some. The ‘Bierock’ that this bakery makes needs NO added condiment. Suggested that you take a taste before you add the condiment. Two other traditional foods sold are the ‘Verenika’ that is a half-moon shaped food comparable to a ravioli stuffed with cottage cheese and a dinner roll hand-made rolled of yeast rising baked dough called ‘Zwiebach’.
